General

- Advanced practice healthcare provider with current/relevant clinical experience in diagnosing and managing non-surgical musculoskeletal conditions.
- Commitment to the mission of improving access to nonsurgical MSK care in local clinics.
- Experience as a licensed provider (NP, CNS, DO, PA, MD, DPT, DPM, DC, etc.) of direct MSK patient care in a clinical setting.
- Experience related to adult/professional education
- Dynamic teaching/presentation/coaching style

Job Duties

Collaborate with the Accredited Provider Program Director (APPD) and Co-Nurse Planner to assess, plan, deliver, and evaluate continuing education based on established curricula to adequately prepare students for the challenges presented in musculoskeletal health as practiced in the primary care setting.

1. Master the curriculum content for any/all of JOF's Orthopedic Primary Care Courses:

- MSK Fundamentals & Skills

- Spine & Metabolic Conditions
- Upper Extremities
- Lower Extremities

2. Co-present at least one 1-day Orthopalooza Workshop per year. Each Workshop focuses on one of the OPC Courses listed above and covers

- MSK history taking
- Specialized MSK exam techniques
- Imaging for MSK conditions
- Joint aspiration and injections
- Treatment planning for common conditions
- Pain management & self-care techniques
- Assistive devices/DME
- Referring appropriately
- Interdisciplinary care and collaboration

3. Provide skills coaching during 1-day, quarterly Orthopalooza Workshops

- MSK specialty exams
- Joint aspiration and injections
- Medical decision-making and case-management

4. Course evaluation

- Review participant evaluations with the OPC Team after each Workshop.
- Participate in periodic review of course content, delivery, and implementation of relevant improvements.

- Co-create a plan to implement suggestions for course and instructor improvement as applicable
5. Adhere to the ANCC and California Board of Registered Nursing accreditation criteria in activity assessment, planning, delivery, and evaluation.

 6. In collaboration with Co-Nurse Planners, revise program content as necessary based on ANCC and California Board of Registered Nursing accreditation criteria in activity assessment, planning, delivery, and evaluation.

Compensation:

- \$700 / 1-day Workshop. Additional compensation is negotiable for curriculum development.
